ALEXANDER WOLSKY is Adjunct Professor of Radiation Biology at New York University's Medical School. He was educated at the University of Budapest and received his doctorate in Zoology in 1928. He worked at the Biological Research Institute (Tihany) of the Hungarian Academy of Science and was its Director during World War II. After the war, following a brief tenure of the chair of General Zoology at the University of Budapest, he joined the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) as Principal Scientific Officer for South and Southeast Asia. In 1954 he came to the United States as Professor (Experimental Embryology and Genetics) at Fordham University, and twelve years later as Professor (Biology) and Head of the Science Departments at Marymount College in Tarrytown, for another six years. His research interest at present concerns the effect of physical and chemical agents on embryonic development (embryopathy) and the theory of the mechanism of evolution. He is Editor-in-Chief of "Monographs in Developmental Biology" (Karger), and one of the Editors of the journal Experimental Cell Biology. He is also, besides being a past or present member of numerous learned societies in the U. S. and abroad, a charter member of the American Teilhard Association and a member of its Board of Directors.
